Ansonia merchants help paint the town purple

ANSONIA - Purple is the city's color of the month.



Ansonia Mayor David S. Cassetti Friday cut a purple ribbon in front of City Hall to demonstrate support of Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month. Purple represents the brain disease.



Resident Bobbi Tar, who lost both of her parents to the degenerative disease, has volunteered for the Alzheimer's Association for several years.

She said, "Ansonia has embodied the concept and I'm very grateful to the city."

Tar said the city's support has been remarkable. "They took this (initiative) on without hesitation."

Cassetti read a proclamation in support of the fight to end Alzheimer's.

He said 78,000 people n

Connecticut are living with the disease, and there are 178,000 caregivers for those who are afflicted.

The proclamation urges people to visit <u>alz.org</u> to learn about early detection and diagnosis, how to recognize warning signs, and more.

More than 35 merchants have joined the June campaign by having donation boxes, posters, and informational pamphlets in their establishments, and purple drinks and desserts are offered at some restaurants.

State Sen. George S. Logan said having so many businesses participating in the initiative to paint the town purple makes him proud of his hometown. "It's not only the (Alzheimer's) patients who suffer but their caregivers as well," he said.
